

# MTB Report 2020

## Highlights for the season

- The MTB Committee held five Spring Series.
- 196 riders competed at various times throughout the season, this included 37 females, and 159 males.
- MTB made a profit of approximately \$4,000 for the series

## Key achievements

- Social media and schools promotion of Spring Series was better than in previous years, thanks to input from Nicola Mitchell.
- All of the Spring Series races were run to a high standard and the general feedback post-race was very positive.
- Online entries accounted for around 2/3 of the total entries, which is consistent with the last few years.

## Issues

- Covid-19 led to the cancellation of the North Island Secondary Schools Championships (due to run in March), the Club Championships and the College Shield (Due to run in May).
